

## Free Tree Sources:

### Tennessee

- **Tennessee Division of Forestry** – Many county offices often provide free tree seedlings for reforestation and conservation efforts. Check their website or contact them directly.
- **University of Tennessee Extension** – There is an extension office in each of the state's 95 counties. Many of their county offices offer or participate in free tree seedling programs, especially during Arbor Day.
- **Tennessee Environmental Council** – They run the Tennessee Tree Program, which has planted over a million native trees across the state. They organize Tennessee Tree Day, where residents can receive trees for a small donation.
- **Trees Knoxville** - hosts a *Free Tree Giveaway* event, where they distribute native species like pawpaw, Shumard oak, flowering dogwood, redbud, elderberry, and red maple.
- **Root Nashville** – A campaign focused on planting 50,000 trees in Davidson County by 2050. They partner with the Tennessee Environmental Council to distribute trees.
- **Local Conservation Districts** – Many county conservation districts in Tennessee offer free or low-cost trees during planting seasons.

### Western Kentucky

- **Kentucky Division of Forestry** – Many county offices often provide free tree seedlings for reforestation and conservation efforts. Check their website or contact them directly.
- **University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service** - There is an extension office in each of Western Kentucky's counties. Many of their county offices offer or participate in free tree seedling programs, especially during Arbor Day.
- **Local Conservation Districts** – Many county conservation districts in Tennessee offer free or low-cost trees during planting seasons.

### National

- **Arbor Day Foundation** – By becoming a member, you can receive **10 free trees**—though a small donation is typically required.
- **National Wildlife Federation**: They provide free native tree seedlings through local restoration projects and community tree giveaway events. You can check their Trees for Wildlife program for opportunities.
- **Local Promotions** - Many cities, counties, and nurseries offer free trees during events like **Arbor Day** or **Earth Day**. Keep an eye on local announcements.
